The Ageing Well programme aims to build a grassroots movement which creates opportunities for healthy ageing in South Ayrshire that is owned and supported by all sectors and partners.

An <u>Ageing Well Movement and Strategy</u>
<u>Board</u> has been established to oversee the Ageing Well programme. The Board will lead on the development of an Ageing Well Strategy for South Ayrshire, alongside driving forward an ambitious programme of work which supports healthy ageing.

Profiling

South Ayrshire has a significantly older population than other parts of Scotland. This is set to increase over the next 20 years when around 20% of the population with be over 75 years.

Public Health Scotland has provided us with a South Ayrshire Older People's profile to help us better understand the future needs and gaps of an ageing population.

Engaging

With Voluntary Action South Ayrshire's (VASA) leadership and support we now have 2 active **Champions Boards** with around 100 older people engaged in and informing the future direction of our work.

We have also initiated an **arts and culture** programme to explore how creativity can support healthy ageing and identify opportunities for older people to participate.
