Locality Planning Partnership Update

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 This report provides a brief update in relation to Locality Planning in South Ayrshire and, in particular, the new arrangements for Locality Planning within the Community Planning Partnership.

2. RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Strategic Planning Advisory Group note the content of this report.

3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 The previous [SPAG report on Locality Planning \(September 2023\)](#) set out general progress on the 6 localities and the Locality Planning Partnerships (LPPs) as well as the emerging work to integrate HSCP/IJB Locality Planning within the broader locus of the Community Planning Partnership (CPP). It also set out a proposed change of locality areas within the 'Ayr' area.

4. REPORT

- 4.1 Both [South Ayrshire IJB](#) and South Ayrshire Community Planning Partnership in October 2023, have agreed with the Locality Planning Partnerships becoming a jointly owned expression of the IJB and the CPP and approved the revised Terms of Reference. (see Appendix 1 – Terms of Reference)
- 4.2 Both South Ayrshire IJB and the CPP also approved the revised Ayr locality areas – namely Ayr Central and North and Ayr South and villages.
- 4.3 In relation to the IJB responsibility re Localities, this proposed revised settlement has been reported to Scottish Government.
- 4.4 The Locality Planning Partnerships continue to meet in each locality area and there are local themes that each are considering but including:
- 4.4.1 Reflecting on their local profile information and developing revised local priorities
- 4.4.2 Developing proposed approaches to allocate their discretionary funding to support their local priorities. This included £21k per locality from the IJB and £15k per locality from the Shared Prosperity Funding.

Ayr North and Ayr South

- Groups considering the broader issues outlined in paper such as the new Terms of Reference, local priorities and the small grants process

Maybole and North Carrick

- Consideration of new Terms of Reference
- Developing new priorities
- Unpaid Carers and Young Carers

Girvan and South Carrick

- Exploring the use of the locally developed Mentally Healthy Toolkit
- Ensuring active engagement in the forthcoming review of Girvan Community Hospital
- An update on First Responders
- Issues linked to Community Transport
- Consideration of the new LPP terms of Reference

4.5.1.1 Consideration of the initiation of the LPPs in their new form with extended CPP membership and updated Terms of Reference. To this end, a meeting to consider this across all localities is organised for 13th December.

4.5.1.2 Consideration for the exact arrangements for the funding allocations including the use of participatory budgeting methods and decision day events. This will be informed by the LPPs judgement re local capacity and support from others in HSCP/Thriving communities and third sector – to enable events to be planned and delivered.

On a sadder note, the passing of David Kiltie in November should be recognised. David was chair of the Maybole Locality Planning Group from its inception for around 4 years. He will be a much missed community voice in Maybole.
