What are the main <b>aims</b> of the policy?	In developing the overall aims of this strategy, a wide range of people including advocacy users, advocacy organisations and other stakeholders will require to be consulted.  This strategy will take account of the following relevant legislations to advocacy:  Mental Health (Care and Treatment) (Scotland) Act 2003; Mental Health (Scotland) Act 2015; Patient Rights (Scotland) Act 2011; Adult Support and Protection (Scotland) Act 2007; Adults with Incapacity (Scotland) Act 2000; Children (Scotland) Act 1995; and Childrens Hearing (Scotland) Act 2011.
	Due to South Ayrshire's Demographic Profile, we expect there to be a continuing increase in demand for Advocacy Services. This particularly relating to South Ayrshire's ageing population and this Strategy should be viewed alongside South Ayrshire's Ageing Well and Social Isolation and Loneliness Strategies. It is expected this will place pressures on local advocacy organisations, due to increase of demand.
	Areas of demand likely to increase:
	Older Adults including those with dementia. Increased identification of longer-term medical conditions; and Unpaid Carers, young and adult.
	The strategy will aim to identify the different types of advocacies presently available within Scotland.
