3.2 Ageing Well

- 3.2.1 Following the last of the Ageing Well Symposiums on Food and Nutrition, there is now a process underway to draft the first iteration of an Ageing Well Strategy to be launched at the Ageing Well event in May at Ayr Town Hall.
- 3.2.2 There has been interest from other areas of Scotland about the Ageing Well work in South Ayrshire including Perth and Kinross, Borders and Dumfries and Galloway.



- 3.2.3 The Scottish Older People's Assembly held an Age Friendly Community and Resourcing conference at COSLA on 26th March at which South Ayrshire provided input about the Age Friendly journey over the past year.
- 3.2.4 This was well received by attendees from all over Scotland and from different organisations.
- 3.2.5 There was a successful inter-generational event Age Without Limits on 20th March (Ageism Action Day) at Belmont Academy led by VASA. This was a wonderful sharing of insights from one generation to another.
- 3.2.6 Elaine Young and Phil White also had a meeting with Dr John Anderson of Public Health Scotland to try to highlight the need for more national focus on this area of work.

3.2 Royal Garden Party Nomination - Phil White

3.2.1 In February we were invited to submit nominations by the Scottish Government, for



someone to attend the Royal Garden Party at The Palace of Holyrood House, Edinburgh on the afternoon of Tuesday 2 July 2024. This once in a lifetime opportunity, for someone who has not previously been invited to attend attracted a number of nominations one of which was for our own Partnership Facilitator, Phil White. We are delighted to report that Phil was selected to attend the summer event.
