The film will then be disseminated to primary schools with an information package for them to share with all primary aged children.  We have held our first secondary school week-long roadshow at Ayr Academy in partnership with the new Whole Family Approach Team and the carers service. We asked the WFA team to partner on this project due to The Weekend addressing parental substance use and thought it important to highlight the drug and alcohol specific support available in addition to support as a young carer. The roadshow consisted of assemblies each morning for S1, S2, S3, and S4-6, followed by a marketplace event where various organisations that can support young carers and families held a stall with information and advice. An electronic survey was completed by the young people who attended – 20% are supporting a loved one due to problematic substance use and 30% believe they are a young carer. All other secondary schools are now arranging a roadshow at their school. This has been delayed due to school holidays and exam leave, but it is hoped that all schools will have completed by the end of this academic year.
