The Practitioner Guide

It includes information about the role of the named person and lead professional and covers Children's Planning including assessment, Request For Assistance and a Child/Young Person's Plan 'My Plan'. It also explains information sharing, which is supported by the Information Sharing Flowchart.

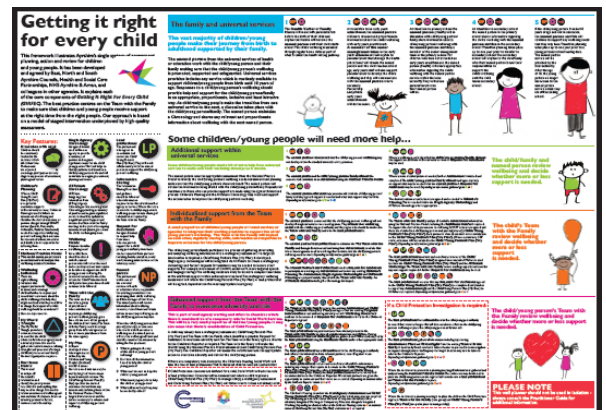


Wall planner of the Ayrshire Child/Young Person's Pathway

This framework illustrates Ayrshire's single system of assessment, planning, and review for a child/young person, following the principles of Getting it right for every child.

Best practice centres on the Team with the Family, to make sure that children receive the right support at the right time from the right people.

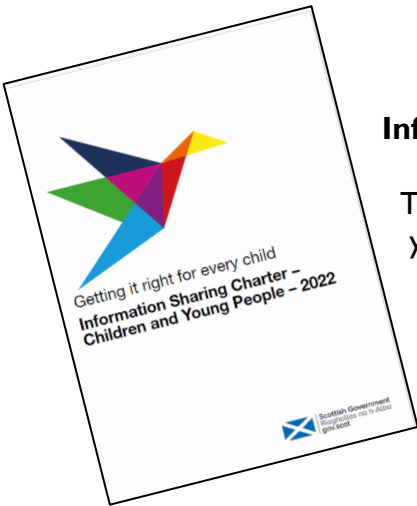
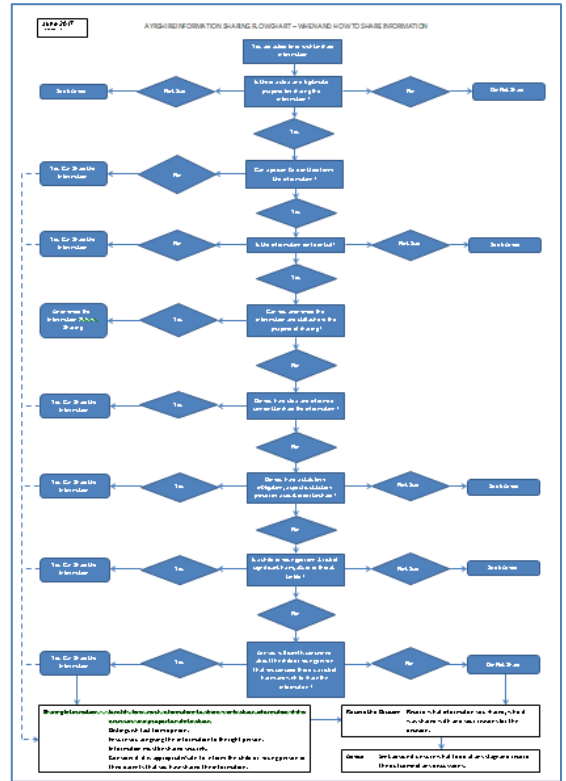

Ayrshire Information Sharing Flowchart

All practitioners working with a child/young person and their family must follow this Information Sharing Flowchart to determine how and when information is shared, in order to improve a child/young person's wellbeing. The guidance on information sharing is contained within the Getting it right for every child/young person Practitioner Guide, which requires to be read in conjunction with the flowchart.

If you are concerned that a child/young person is at risk of significant harm, follow your child protection procedures.



Information Sharing Charter – Children and Young People

The Scottish Government charter is a guide to your rights and explains how you can expect the Scottish Government to manage information about you and aims to make your rights, to do with your personal information, easier to understand.

Information Sharing Charter – Parents and Carers

The Scottish Government charter explains how you can expect information about you/your child/young person to be managed and aims to make your privacy rights easier to understand.
