Service Providers are engaged and consulted on an on- going basis through Service Providers Forums and Quality Assurance visits. Consultation took place with Service Providers and service users and carers/Guardians/Social Workers. The draft Commissioning Plan for Learning Disability was shared with the following Service providers, Enable Scotland, Hansel Alliance, Key Housing, Turning Point Scotland, Partners for Inclusion, Quarriers, Blackwood Care, Richmond Fellowship Scotland, SA HSCP In-house Learning Disability Chalmers Road Team, SA HSCP In- house Learning Disability/Mental Health Community Team, SAC Procurement and Sandra Rae, SA HSCP Senior Manager Learning Disability and Sensory Impairment, at an MS Teams meeting on the 26 <sup>th</sup> May 2023, the document was subsequently sent out to allow these organisations to provide their comments and suggested feedback on the Commissioning Plan and feedback has informed the current document.
