HSCP STRATEGIC RISK REGISTER

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This The purpose of this report is to present the IJB with a revised HSCP Strategic Risk Register for noting.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 It is recommended that the Performance and Audit Committee:
 - i. Note the content of the HSCP Strategic Risk Register (Appendix 1).

3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1. The refreshed HSCP Strategic Risk Register was approved by the IJB in May and was developed by officers through the HSCP's Risk and Resilience Group with input from a range of colleagues and partners within the NHS and Council.
- 3.2. The content of the Strategic Risk Register brings together highlights and high-level risks from South Ayrshire Council and NHS Ayrshire and Arran, with the addition of HSCP-specific risks. The risks that have been identified are as follows:

Theme: Protection

- 1. Adult and Child Protection
- 2. Workforce Protection
- 3. External Factors including Contingency Planning
- 4. Climate change and Sustainability

Theme: Resources

- 5. Financial position
- 6. ICT
- 7. Premises
- 8. Workforce Development
- 9. Provider organisations

Theme: Governance

10. Good governance, Strategic Planning and Business

Resilience

- 11. Population
- 12. Communication and Reputation
- 13. Service Quality
- 3.3. Although the council and NHS maintain their own approach to risk covering HSCP services, and operational risks are managed at a service level, it is



prudent and in keeping with best practice for the HSCP to maintain its own Strategic Risk Register.

4. REPORT

- 4.1 Since the last update the Strategic Risk Register has continued to be developed by officers through the HSCP's Risk and Resilience Group with input from a range of colleagues and partners within the NHS and Council.
- 4.2 There continues to be a high degree of pressure on the hospital and community care system both in South Ayrshire and nationally, with delayed transfers of care continuing to take place and ongoing staff shortages impacting third and independent sector providers of care.
- 4.3 With this in mind, risks **7 (Workforce development)** and **9 (Provider organisations)** have been updated to reflect the current pressures on the system as well as the proposed and current mitigations actions in place to address these challenges.
- 4.4 Workforce development is now a significant risk, moving from a risk score of 8 to 16, due to the potential that there may not be enough staff to occupy all roles across the HSCP (and providers). In order to mitigate this risk the HSCP management team have established a Care at Home Short Life Working Group with proposals to recruit more staff to Care at Home by January 2022.
- 4.5 The Provider Organisation risk is now significant (increasing from a risk score of 6 to 12) due to an increase in the likelihood of the potential risks identified occurring. Progress has been made on the proposed actions to mitigate this risk, with further development taking place on the Quality Assurance Framework.
- 4.6 Risk 6 (Premises) has increased from a score of 9 to 12, which is also now a significant risk due to an increase in the potential impact of staff having limited opportunity for face-to-face collaboration due to the impact of ongoing COVID-19 restrictions. The HSCP management team are continuing to scope out what future accommodation requirements may be and are establishing a list of priority buildings for investment.
