LOCALITY PLANNING GROUPS UPDATE

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT


4. REPORT

4.1 Decision Days/Participatory Budgeting

£13k of funding has been identified to support local Decision Days in each locality addressing locally agreed priorities. (This is a combination of existing small grants allocation (£5k), monies from Covid related programmes (£2k) and wellbeing Pledge monies (£6k).

The publicity for applications to the local Participatory Budgeting/ Decision Day events was disseminated in early November via LPP networks, Social Media and other linked networks.

Submissions were to address identified local priority issues as set out below:

Risk Assessment – HSCP staff have been linking to Council staff to develop risk assessments for the secondary school venues for the Decision Days (which all have large spaces, ability to separate participants and with good ventilation.

Applications closed on 29th November and a number of applications have been received from a wide variety of organisations from all sectors of the community including sports, arts and cultural organisations.

Applications will be screened for suitability week commencing 6th December 2021 and all relevant organisations notified.

There are some organisations that have submitted applications to more than one Locality Planning Partnership. This will be reviewed as part of the screeening process.

4.2 Re-launch events

Re-launch events had been provisionally planned for February/March.

Following discussion with LPP Chairs it was agreed that we would keep these dates under review particularly in the light of new Covid related concerns.

It was agreed that meeting in person was very important for these events and if that meant a slight delay, this would be appropriate.

SPAG members are being asked to support LPPs to identify the safest and most appropriate timing for Re-launch events.



4.3 Other issues

- Truacanta groups have been engaged in some conversations on the Ayrshire-wide Truacanta approach linked to better End of Life and Bereavement support
- CPR Training Scottish Fire and Rescue/Police Scotland are offering community CPR training in 2022 and LPPs are being linked into this
- Links to Place Planning Place Planning has been more intensively carried out across South Ayrshire over the past few months (with more to take place in early 2022). This has included development work within villages (for example 6 South Carrick Villages) as well as bigger towns
- Membership LPPs are also seeking to improve the range of representation (including of local residents). This will also be addressed through the Re-launch process.
- Local priorities some LPPs are reviewing existing priorities and identifying appropriate issues to focus attention on in next period.
