LOCALITY PLANNING AND REPRESENTATION ON STRATEGIC PLANNING ADVISORY GROUP

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to update SPAG members on key developments and issues related to Locality Planning in South Ayrshire.

3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 This report outlines information from the most recent round of Locality Planning Partnership meetings and the LPP Chairs meeting on 10/02/22.

4. REPORT

4.1 Decision Days/Participatory Budgeting

There was a full range of 6 local Decision Days planned for early 2022 as reported at the previous SPAG meeting.

Because of the concerns over Covid transmission (particularly the Omicron strain) it was agreed to cancel the events.

LPPs then worked to be able to consider the applications for small grant funding in order to make timeous decisions and to allocate local grants.

This was successfully carried out and a summary of the allocated grants is appended.

This was a challenging situation and thanks are due to the Partnership Engagement Officers and LPP members who made alternative arrangements speedily.

A summary of the Decision Day proces and awards is appended.

4.2 Re-launch events

At the previous SPAG, LPP Chairs had suggested a re-framing of the timetable for re-launch events, with considerable preference for in situ local events being made.

At the most recent LPP Chairs meeting it was suggested to have re-launch events subsequent to the election of new Community Councillors and, potentially, new Elected Members (local elections in early May).

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4.3 Other issues

- **Truacanta** – groups have been engaged in dialogue on the Ayrshire-wide Truacanta approach linked to better End of Life and Bereavement support. There is an Ayrshire-wide event on the morning of 25th March in Fullarton Connexions.
- **Links to Place Planning** – Place Planning has been more intensively carried out across South Ayrshire over the past few months. The residual Place Planning is due to take place before the next local government elections. SPAG Members might be interested in the total set of Place Plans for South Ayrshire. (An input from a senior SAC officer on Place Planning might be a useful for SPAG members).
- **Communication** – the need to improve communication to, from and among LPPs is a recurrent theme and to this end, there will be a specific workshop supported by the HSCP Communications Officer to explore ways of making improvements at a locality level.
- **Local priorities** – some LPPs are reviewing existing priorities and identifying appropriate issues to focus attention on in next period.
- **Thriving Communities** – meeting taking place with Thriving Communities manager to identify future ways of working together at locality level.

Decision Day Summary

Decision Days are a way for local people to have a say in which projects should be funded within their local community. There was £13,000 available within each locality area and the money was made up of different strands of funding including Locality Small Grants allocation, Community Planning Covid funding (small amount) and HSCP Wellbeing funding. Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions the decision was taken to cancel the in-person events and a Small Grants Process was undertaken by each locality.

Local groups could apply for grants for up to and not exceeding £1000. The spirit of the Decision Day funding was to allow smaller grass roots organisations to access modest amounts of money to support local projects

Funding applications were aligned to one or more of the Locality Planning Partnership priorities. Overall 87 organisations applied for funding and 73 were successful.
