MINISTERIAL STRATEGIC GROUP ACTION PLAN

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to submit to IJB for an update on progress with the MSG Action Plan agreed by IJB in September 2019.

2. RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Integration Joint Board approves the updated Action Plan attached at Appendix 1 and note progress made to date.

3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 At its meeting on 4 September 2019, the IJB approved the submission to the Scottish Government of the Action Plan developed in response to the Self Evaluation of progress with Integration which had been undertaken in the Spring of 2019.
- 3.2 In the period since September 2019, progress on the Action Plan has been considered by both the IJB and Performance and Audit Committee and by the Three Way Meeting. This paper provides a further update on the progress made to address the areas identified in the Action Plan.

4. REPORT

- 4.1 At the IJB in September 2019 it was agreed that progress on the delivery of the Action Plan would be reported regularly to the IJB Performance and Audit Committee and to the Three-Way Meeting Strategic Group comprising IJB, South Ayrshire Council and NHS Ayrshire and Arran representatives.
- 4.2 Progress with each of the 31 areas for improvement is detailed in Appendix 1.
- 4.3 For 14 of the areas of improvement in the Action Plan the necessary work has been completed. In many areas there has been significant progress.
- 4.4 The Review of the Integration Scheme which was concluded in March 2020 was a significant undertaking. Although the review concluded that no changes to the scheme were immediately required it was agreed that further work be undertaken in relation to aspects of financial management and in

relation to the delegation Children and Families Social Work Services to the HSCP.

- 4.5 There remain a number of areas where progress has been more limited. Primarily these are associated with actions where capacity provided by the appointment of the Senior Manager for Planning and Performance was felt to be critical. Although the appointment was made in February, the Covid-19 emergency has meant that the post-holder has needed to focus on other duties. It is anticipated that areas associated with the development of the IJB will form a key element of the work plan over the coming period.
- 4.6 A key outstanding action is the requirement to develop a clearer statement on governance and scrutiny arrangements across the three statutory partners. A draft paper which outlined the proposed arrangements was considered at the Three Way Meeting on 4 September. The development of final proposals is in progress.

5. STRATEGIC CONTEXT

- 5.1 The successful delivery of the Action Plan will contribute to the following IJB Strategic Objectives:
 - We will manage resources effectively, making best use of our integrated capacity.
 - We will give all of our stakeholders a voice.
