




### Alcohol-related deaths (all ages) 2015-2019













## Data- main points Ayr North Harbour, Wallacetown and Newton South




### North and South divide in Deprivation and Life Expectancy

This map of Ayr shows the areas of deprivation within the town, with dark red being areas of most deprived zones and dark blue being least deprived. From the map, it is clear there is an obvious divide. Ayr North has 11 SIMD 2020 zones in decile 1 i.e. the top 10% most deprived areas in Scotland.

### Life Expectancy

People in Ayr North are living less of their life in good health and dying younger than in neighbouring areas and South Ayrshire.


Despite being only approximately 2.5 miles apart, on average, the life expectancy of a man born in Ayr North Harbour, Wallacetown and Newton South area is **14 years less** than his counterpart in Alloway & Doonfoot, and a woman **13 years lower**.





### Early Death aged 15-44

Premature mortality rates (under 75) in Scotland are higher in the most deprived areas compared with the least deprived. In Ayr, the rate of early death among 15–44 age group in the most deprived area is six times higher than the least deprived area and three times higher than South Ayshire.

Drug related deaths and suicides aged 15-44



More than half of deaths in this age group are drug-related or suicide. This is consistent with Scotland overall.

Number of drug related deaths and suicides is **5X higher** than the next cause of death which is cancer



**Drug related deaths** are most common for both males and females, which is consistent with Scotland overall.



In Ayr, there have been 73 drug related deaths overall 2016-2020 (47 male, 26 female) and 47 alcohol related deaths during the same time period (24 male, 23 female).

The alcohol related death rate for the over 65 age group is higher than the rate for the under 65 age group for all geographies. However, the difference is not statistically significant within Ayr.

### **Hospital Admissions**


The **alcohol related admissions** rate for males is 1,235 per 100,000 population and female is 655 per 100,000, which is statistically significant. The highest age group for females is 45–64, similar to South Ayrshire, Ayrshire and Arran and Scotland. However, the age group for males in Ayr is 25–44 which is different to these other geographies where is it 45–64years.



The rate of **drug related hospital stays** for males and females is higher in Ayr than Scotland. However, the difference compared to South Ayrshire and Ayrshire and Arran is not statistically significant. The 25–44 age group has the highest rate of admissions which is higher than South Ayrshire and Scotland.




In Ayr North, approximately one third of people are income deprived with 35–40% population are in receipt of out of work benefits. This compares to 18% in South Ayrshire and 16% in Scotland.



### Introduction


Ayr North Harbour, Wallacetown and Newton South is an Intermediate Zone within the town of Ayr in the South Ayrshire Council area. It has a current population of 4,612 (2020).



### **Main Points**


- Ayr North Harbour, Wallacetown and Newton South is an area of high deprivation with 68% of its
  population classed as living in SIMD Quintile 1. This compares to 17% in South Ayrshire overall.
- People are living less of their life in good health and dying younger than in neighbouring areas and South Ayrshire.
  - Female life expectancy is 9 years lower than for South Ayrshire as a whole and 13 years lower than the area in Ayr with the highest life expectancy.
  - Male life expectancy is 8 years lower than for South Ayrshire as a whole and nearly 14 years lower than the area in Ayr with the highest life expectancy.
  - o The rate of deaths aged 15-44 is more than 3 times higher than South Ayrshire.
  - o The rate of early deaths from Coronary Health Disease is 2.5 times higher than South Ayrshire.
- One-third of children are living in poverty.
- There is a combination of social inequalities including:
  - o 40% of the population are in receipt of out of work benefits. This compares to 18% in South Ayrshire and 16% in Scotland.
  - o The crime rate is more than 3 times higher than in South Ayrshire as a whole.
  - o Nearly half of households are single occupancy.

### Deaths, aged 15-44



The rate of deaths aged 15-44 in Ayr North Harbour, Wallacetown and Newton South has consistently been higher than South Ayrshire. Following an increase over recent years, it is currently more than three times the local authority rate.





It is currently 1.8 times higher than the percentage in South Ayrshire.


### Population in receipt of out of work benefits

It is currently 2.5 times higher than South Ayrshire.


### **Crime rate**



### Early deaths from coronary heart disease (age <75)





#### **Development concerns at 27-30 months**




