#### 3. <u>REPORT</u>

3.1 Topics for noting are detailed below.

#### IJB Member session (am)

- 3.2 Members of the IJB were invited to and attended a development day which was held on 8<sup>th</sup> March 2023 at West of Scotland University campus in Ayr. The purpose of the day was to present, share and discuss service data, provision, challenges, and improvements/actions currently impacting on matters such as delayed discharge, care at home, workforce and initial response etc.
- 3.3 The presenters drew together a range of data, looking at local, national and Local Authority comparator HSCP's to afford the IJB and attendees the opportunity to gain a greater understanding of the current challenges and pressures. This collaborative approach was well received and provided opportunity to explore the current position and what work was being carried out to address the challenges.
- 3.4 Future updates will be brought to the IJB and a future workshop will be planned to report progress, improvements and future work streams etc for early Autumn. Members can review the presentation slides for the event in Slide Deck Power Point (*IJB UWS combined*).

#### IJB Self-Assessment (pm)

3.5 Members of the IJB and Officers from the HSCP were joined in the by Barry McLeod and Thomas Boyle from Improvement Service. The HSCP engaged



with Improvement Service late 2022 with the intention to review and identify key priority areas. Following initial discussion with Mr McLeod, Improvement Service issued a self-assessment survey to members of the IJB which was used to create the structure and focus for the afternoon session.

- 3.6 The session was broken into 3 parts. An overall summary of the completed survey; the identification of 5 key areas for improvement for groups to consider and a second session which would further develop an action plan for 2 key priorities. A total of 12 respondents submitted a survey. Attendees at the session used the information emerging from the survey to develop thinking on two priority areas for improvement. These are:
  - Review how performance information is used by the IJB to ensure it is timely, relevant and provides a good measure of progress towards agreed outcomes.
  - Review the key targets for the IJB to ensure they remain ambitious, stretching and relevant.
- 3.7 Improvement Service will submit the combined workshop identified actions to the HSCP to progress and a further update on this will be brought to the IJB in due course.

#### Joint Inspection of Adult Services

3.8 The final report from the Joint Inspection of Adult Services will be published on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2023. A full briefing will be provided to the IJB on the findings when they are made public.
