REPORT BY ADP CHAIR AND ADP LEAD OFFICER

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide details of the predicated RAGB 2022 / 2023 status for the implementation of the Medication Assisted Treatment Standards (MAT) in South Ayrshire and share the MAT Q4 Improvement Plan.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 It is recommended that the Performance and Audit Committee notes the predicated MAT RAGB report for 2022 / 2023 and the Q4 MAT Improvement Plan.

3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1. In May 2021, as part of the national mission, the Scottish Government and the Drug Death Task Force published the new Medication Assisted Treatment Standards (MAT Standards). The 10 new standards for treatment for drug users aim to ensure everyone has access to the support which works best for them, reinforcing a rights-based approach for people who use drugs, and the treatment they should expect.
- 3.2. Following the publication of the standards, a local baseline assessment, against all the standards and criteria, was undertaken and submitted to the ADP in July 2021. Following further discussions, including discussions with the national MAT Implementation Support Team (MIST) and a local ADP / MAT Workshop, a revised RAG+ status was approved by the ADP on 9th December 2022.
- 3.3. As part of the implementation of the MAT Standards ADPs were asked to develop Projection Service Specification (PSD) detailing the scale up activities for MAT 1 5, including any requests for additional funding to support these activities. Following a review of the PSD, MIST confirmed a four-year allocation to South Ayrshire ADP of £340k per year for the next four years. The funding will provide additional capacity in the South Ayrshire Treatment and Recovery Team to support the scale up activities and to allow service redesign to take place. MIST have also confirmed funding for a Pan Ayrshire Clinical Psychologist post.
- 3.4. Local arrangements were put in place for the implementation of the MAT Standards with regular updates on progress being provided to the ADP. A Pan Ayrshire Steering Group was established to provide an oversight and governance role for relevant Pan Ayrshire strategic activities.
- 3.5. As part national monitoring of the implementation of the MAT Standards every area in Scotland is required to submit a range of Process, Numerical and Experiential evidence to the MIST Team by 14th April 2023.



- 3.6. On 23rd June 2022 Public Health Scotland published the <u>National benchmarking report on implementation of the Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) standards</u>. The report showed that while progress had been made in all areas in Scotland, the MAT Standards have not been fully implemented by April 2022.
- 3.7. The Benchmarking Report also recommended a revised timetable for full implementation of the MAT Standards as:
 - April 2023 Fully implement MATs 1–5, partially implement MATs 6–10 in community services.
 - April 2024 Fully implement MATs 1–10 in community.
 - April 2025 Fully implement MATs 1-10 justice settings.
- 3.8 On 2nd August 2022 Public Health Scotland published <u>Supplementary</u> information for the national benchmarking report on implementation of the MAT Standards.
- 3.9 In June 2022, the Minister for Drugs Policy wrote to Health Board and Local Authority Chief Executives and Integration Authority Chief Officers outlining the Ministers expectations and oversight arrangements in each area to ensure full implementation of the MAT Standards. The letter included the expectation for each area in Scotland to develop and publish a Local Improvement Plans by the end of September, which must be personally approved by Chief Officers and involve the voices of those with living and lived experience.

4. REPORT

- 4.1 Predicted RAGB Status 2022 / 2023
- 4.1.1 To support ADPs with preparing the evidence to support the annual RAGB assessment process, MIST developed a Support To Implement and Report (STiR) where MIST multiagency teams met with the ADPs to explain the RAGB process and to provide support for gathering the required evidence.
- 4.1.2 Following discussions and meeting with MIST, the draft Process Evaluation template was submitted to MIST in February 2023. Following review and further discussions MIST have developed a Predicted RAGB Report March 2023 (Appendix 1). The predicated RAGB maybe subject to change when the Numerical and Experiential Data has been submitted and reviewed on 14th April 2023. Where the predicted and evidenced based RAGB do not match, there will be further discussion between MIST and the ADP.
- 4.1.3 The required Numerical evidence requested by MIST has been extracted by the NHS Prevention & Services Support Team.
- 4.1.4 An Experiential evidence process has been pilot by the ADP / RecoveryAyr Team, with evidence collected from individuals accessing medication assisted treatment, family members and staff working in services providing MAT and



- related support. The process will be further developed and embedded as routine evidence collection in 2023 / 2024.
- 4.1.5 Due to the significant amount of activity and support provided by a range of ADP partners, the predicted RAGB for South Ayrshire is Provisional Green for MAT Standards 1 5 and Amber for MAT 6 10 (Appendix 1).
- 4.1.6 As MIST are developing the reporting criteria for MAT Standards 6 10, the evidence provided in 2022 / 2023 is a self-evaluation by each ADP area, therefore no area will receive a Green rating.
- 4.2 Quarter 4 Improvement Plan 2022 / 2023
- 4.2.1 The South Ayrshire MAT Improvement Plan was developed with partners taking into consideration the local baseline assessment, benchmarking report and local supplementary report, as well at the ADP Learning Review activities.
- 4.2.2 The Justice and Primary Care actions were developed and agreed on a pan-Ayrshire basis through the appropriate processes including the GP Sub Committee.
- 4.2.3 The Improvement Plan was approved by the ADP and Chief Officers in September 2022 and published on the <u>ADP website</u>.
- 4.2.4 Local governance and oversight of the Improvement Plan is throughquarterly progress reports to the ADP and the Integration Joint Board. The ADP lived experience lead STEAR Subgroup also provides a governance and oversight role.
- 4.2.5 Appendix 2 provides the Quarter 4 2022/ 2023 Improvement Plan. The ADP, and its partners, have made considerable progress with the implementation of the improvement actions detailed within the Quarter 4 report and will continue to work at pace to implement the MAT Standards in 2023 / 2024.

5. STRATEGIC CONTEXT

- 5.1 The implementation of the MAT Standards is in line with the vision, principles and priorities set out within the ADP Strategy, Recovery is Reality 2020 2024, and the <u>National Drugs Mission Plan 2022 2026.</u>
- 5.2 This report contributes to the IJB Strategic Objective to 'operate sound strategic and operational management systems and processes.'

8. RISK ASSESSMENT

8.1 The ambitious national programme of implement and embed the MAT Standards presents challenges, for example recruitment of staffing, associated change activities and pan Ayrshire discussions in relation to MAT Standard 7 and Justice actions. The ADP continues to collaborate closely with partners and MIST to take forward the required activities, where possible mitigating the risks, and provide updates to the ADP.

<u>Purpose</u>: To identify areas that need support for implementation and measurement and to agree with ADPs a predicted RAGB to help manage the June evidence based RAGB report.

<u>Method:</u> MIST multidisciplinary teams met with colleagues in Alcohol and Drug Partnerships (ADPs) to explain the RAGB assessment process, provide support for challenges and disseminate learning.

<u>Significance:</u> The Predicted RAGB is to facilitate sign off on the evidence based RAGB for the June report. The Predicted RAGB is subject to change once the data is submitted on April 14 2023. Where the predicted and evidence based RAGB do not match there will be further discussion.

Explanation of the RAGB Status

Link to guidance: Guidance (RAGB Assessment 2022-23). Version 4.0 270223 .docx

- Addition of 'Provisional Amber' and Provisional Green.'
- The reason for *Provisional Amber* is to enable the distinction to be drawn between an ADP that has progressed to good implementation but not yet in all settings/services, and an ADP that is at a very early stage of implementation, often in a single setting/service (this situation is usually linked to recruitment difficulties) and where there is as yet no or minimal evidence of patient benefit.
- The reason for **Provisional Green** is to accommodate the challenge of getting all 3 strands of evidence to demonstrate evidence of patient benefit for all settings/services in an ADP; even where there is other evidence of full implementation. The biggest challenge will be experiential evidence across all settings/services including in remote and rural areas.

Red: There is no or limited evidence of implementation of the standard in MAT services.

- The transition from Red to Amber requires evidence that work has started and is expected to continue.
- Where one or more evidence stream is lacking, where the scale is still very small, and there is no or minimal evidence of patient benefit; but where clinical intelligence indicates that work is started and set up to continue – Provisional Amber
- This is most likely to occur where an ADP has only a small and early test of change in place, or an SOP but as yet no or minimal evidence of patient benefit.



Amber: There is evidence of partial implementation of the standard in MAT services.

Amber is a broad category that can include a situation where an area has just started to implement a standard in one MAT setting/service of the ADP area (Provisional Amber), or a situation where an ADP area has well established implementation and evidence of patient benefit across most, but not all, MAT settings/services.

The transition from Amber to Green:

- Requires process, numerical and experiential evidence that the standard is equitably implemented and that there is patient benefit across all unique combinations of settings/services that offer MAT and OST across the ADP area.
- In remote and rural areas, the assessment will consider small numbers, local challenges, and the extent to which the assessment indicates maximisation of local resource (the Remote and Rural process template can help this discussion).
- For MAT 6-10 transition from Amber to Green will require numerical evidence from local audits. For financial year 2022/23 this will be discussed between the ADP and MIST on a case-by-case basis. MIST and ADPs have not yet agreed formal numerical measures for MAT standard 6-10. This will be done in financial year 2023/24.
- Where one evidence stream is lacking and it is not possible to demonstrate patient benefit across all settings/services in an ADP area, but clinical and local intelligence and the other 2 evidence streams indicate that work is set up and delivering across all settings/services in an ADP area Provisional Green. This is most likely to occur due to a lack of experiential data. A lack of process or numerical data in a given setting/service may occur in small areas but mostly this will come under the remote and rural assessment.

Green: There is evidence of full implementation of the standard in all unique combinations of setting and service that offer MAT and OST across the ADP area.

The transition from green to blue requires process, numerical and experiential evidence to demonstrate full implementation and patient benefit across an ADP area for at least 2 years.

Blue: There is evidence of sustained implementation and ongoing monitoring of the standard across all MAT services.

- The evidence to support ongoing full implementation needs to be kept under review annually. This is to mitigate against risks such as re-commissioning of a partner that may reduce resources essential to sustained improvement. For example, if ongoing assessment indicates that the standard is no longer met, and patient benefit is not sustained then the RAGB status may need to be reviewed downward.
- The details of what form ongoing assessment will take is to be worked out with ADPs in financial year 2023-24 but will likely include support to report updates and annual benchmarking reviews.
