Equality Impact Assessment and proposed engagement plan completed and sent to Council Legal Team for comment prior to formal consultation process to take place subsequent to advice but likely to be within May 2023.

Public Health Scotland LIST Analyst Team are producing better graphic 'maps' for proposed Ayr localities.

#### **4.2 Engagement with Community Planning Partners**

There has been ongoing positive embracing of HSCP Locality model within dialogue at different CPP groups including the SDP Chairs Group.

A recent Wallacetown SDP workshop embraced the idea of a wider 'Ayr North' locality.

There is also general agreement (still to be formally approved at CPP Board level) to develop, in time, locality plans, starting with Ayr North as a test site.

#### **4.3 Engagement re draft Terms of Reference for new LPPs**

Draft Terms of Reference for the proposed new Locality Planning Partnerships have been developed and are now the subject of engagement and consultation with individual LPPs.

#### **4.4 Other issues emerging from LPPs**

**Carer Days** – following the positive Prestwick and Troon Carer Days, there are plans for an event for Ayr on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2023 which also falls within the National Carers Week.

**Service Changes** -LPPs have also been engaged with NHS staff in relation to proposed changes to Cancer Services.
