# **ADULT COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH STRATEGY 2017-2022**

# 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide an update to the Performance and Audit Committee on the queries raised on 19/04/2023.

## 3. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 3.1 The Adult Community Mental Health Strategy 2017-2022 and associated Implementation Plan was approved by the <u>Integration Joint Board on 13 June 2017</u>. This paper provides an update on the queries raised at the PAC meeting 19/04/2023
  - The report in 4.1.3 how are the gaps realised form recruitment being covered
  - 2.1 action list re technology mentions this throughout the action list, but not sure what "technology" is that is offered can we define what that looks like.
  - The action tracker only offers some of the actions (based on the numbering of these) can we update on the others please or provide clarity if the numbers are "out of sync".

# 4. REPORT

- 4.1 The report presented to Performance and Audit Committee stated that "Recent analysis of demand and activity within South CMHT has identified gap of eight whole time equivalent nursing staff to respond to expected tasks. Further work is required to identify risks associated with this pressure alongside requests for additional funding. This has been further exacerbated by a significant rise in referrals for treatment for ADHD and other neurodevelopmental conditions."
- 4.2 This gap of 8WTE nursing staff is not in relation to recruitment issues but in relation to the funded staffing establishment of nursing staff. A similar exercise was completed in North and East Ayrshire HSCP with a similar shortfall identified. In order to manage the risks associated with this deficit all tasks associated with the current nursing workload have been RAG rated to identify the priority tasks (RED) that must be completed and tasks that can be delayed (GREEN). In addition, a panAyrshire duty service has been established to facilitate our response to urgent referrals. The service has also placed a temporary pause on new adult referrals for ADHD which is a new and emerging demand however we are seeking to offer a limited assessment service from



June 2023. An extreme team is being developed to consider the service response to adult ADHD referrals and will be informed by the 4 National Pilot sites across Scotland that are considering this issue.

4.3 There is a range of technologies being used within Adult and Older Adult Community mental health services. These include but are not limited to:

Apps e.g. sleepio, daylight app

Online CBT e.g. Silvercloud, Beating the Blues

Echo for programming range of technology to support home living

Near me (remote appointments)

Ring doorbell

Mobile phone reminders

Proposal for Digital Navigator to build on previous work of mPower

Mobile ECG machines for physical health checks

4.4 Action tracker; a review of the action plan was undertaken to reflect learning and changes to service delivery due to the Covid-19 pandemic. This resulted in a number of duplicate or similar actions being combined as well as a number of actions being replaced by more relevant actions. As a result the numbers do not run sequentially.
